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BEWARE OF MOCKERY

The act of mockery can be seen when the people at our Lord Jesus Christ was crucified, where both the soldiers and the crowd mocked him, calling him "King of the Jews" and jeering at his claims of being the Messiah particularly found in Matthew 27:29, Mark 15:32 and Luke 23:36-37. This act not only shows the deep hatred and rejection of Jesus by some but also emphasizes his humility and endurance in the face of such scorn.

Mockery of Jesus, as seen during His crucifixion, was not just an act of insult but a reflection of deep spiritual blindness. Even today, people continue to mock Christ and His followers, sometimes out of ignorance, pride, or rebellion. Psalm 1:1-2 reminds believers of the importance of staying away from the company of mockers and instead delighting in God's word.

The contrast between the two criminals crucified alongside Jesus serves as a powerful example of how people respond differently when confronted with their sin, one in humility, seeking mercy, and the other in pride, rejecting salvation. We all are sinners, the difference between us is the response we give when we are confronted with the fact that we have sinned. While some out of humility seek forgiveness, some out of pride despise rebuke and end up condemned in hell.

Proverbs 1:22-30 and 1 Timothy 1:9-12 serve as strong warnings. Those who reject God's wisdom and scoff at the truth ultimately face consequences, whereas true believers are called to pursue righteousness and godliness.



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UNDERSTANDING

HOW TO FACILITATE THE FULFILMENT OF PROPHECIES

What is a Prophecy? Prophecy is a prediction of what will happen in the future Jeremiah 29:11
 Prophecies are not given for fun but for fulfilment. The primary purpose of a Prophecy is for fulfilment.
 Prophecies have 3 main sources

- i) **The Word of God (Biblical or Scriptural)**
- ii) **The Holy Spirit**
- iii) **God's sent Prophet.**

But for this topic, our focus will be on the Word of God (Biblical Source) which is very applicable and common amongst believers and serves as the foundation for prophecy fulfilment in which the other two sources hang on.

Biblical prophecy is said to be a more sure word of prophecy 2Peter 1:19-21

Biblical prophecy can be likened to a covenant Psalms 89:34. In the Old Testament there are 1,239 Prophecies and 578 Prophecies in the New Testament making a total of 1,807 Prophecies in the Bible.

There are two dimensions of Biblical Prophecies

1. **Direct Biblical Prophecy**
2. **Applied Biblical Prophecy**

Direct Biblical Prophecy gives accurate details of Prophecies such as name, place, and time Examples: Birth of Jesus Isaiah 7:14, 9:6 this prophecy came to fulfilment after 700 years Matthew 1:20-23, the Crucifixion of Jesus Psalms 22:16-18, John 19:23-24 This prophecy came to fulfilment about 1,000 years later.

The Babylonian captivity Jeremiah 25:11, Ezra 1:1-3

Jesus' Mission statement Isa 61:1-4, Luke 4:18.

How to facilitate the fulfilment of Prophecies

1. We must receive and believe the prophetic word in our heart Luke 1:36-45
2. We must commit to the demand of the prophetic word John 2:5 for every prophecy to be fulfilled conditions are attached eg: prayers, fasting, giving, kingdom stewardship, obedience 1 Timothy 1:18, John 9:1-7
3. Engage the power of bold declaration Prov 18:21, Isaiah 43:26, Psalms 81:10 if you keep saying it the Word will grow above your doubt and negative thinking.

Continue to celebrate the Prophetic word like Abraham and King Hezekiah Romans 4:17-21, Isaiah 38:19
 Remain ever Blessed Jesus Is Lord.

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UNDERSTANDING KINGDOM PROSPERITY

PART ONE

One of today's most abused and misunderstood messages is the gospel of prosperity. To truly understand kingdom prosperity, we must first let go of extreme and unscriptural views. Contrary to generally perceived opinions, Prosperity has little or nothing to do with money. Money alone doesn't make poor people rich, rather it might make them poorer because it empowers those who lack financial education to incur expenses they can't sustain. Most people erroneously liken prosperity to materialism. In the book of Joshua, the bible explains prosperity, "This book of the law shall not depart from thy mouth, but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shall have good success". Jos. 1:8. It takes a man whose ways God has prospered to succeed. Prosperity means to succeed in all our God's given endeavors.

Prosperity is all-encompassing. God's perspective of prosperity is different from the world's view of prosperity. The world sees prosperity as having plenty of money in the account. It is a state of all-round well-being. It predisposes a state of well-being of our body, soul and spirit being blessed by the Lord (3 John 1:2). Kingdom prosperity starts from the inner man and later manifests outwardly. It transcends mere financial and material abundance. This is so because even the devil and his cohorts (agents) have money and worldly possessions. Prosperity, as we shall get to know in this paper surpasses material things (worldly possessions) in general.

Is Kingdom Prosperity the Will of God?

The will of God is the word of God and it can be found in the Scriptures. Any personal vision, revelation, dreams, understanding, teachings, word of knowledge and wisdom that does not conform to the written word (bible) should be ignored. We are in an age where people oppose the will of God. Some attempt to give personal interpretations of the bible to suit their caprices. Like never before, this age has witnessed false teachers and doctrine. By this, I mean unbiblical doctrines. Our only source of teaching should be the scripture (bible) (2 Tim. 3:16-17). It pleases the lord when his servants prosper "Let them shout for joy, and be glad, that favour my righteous cause; ye let them say continually, let the lord be magnified, which hath pleasure in the prosperity (well-being) his servant", Ps 35:27. NIV God is delighted in the prosperity (well-being) of those who serve him and favour his righteous cause. He has pleasure in the prosperity of their temporal and spiritual affairs. God is delighted not in our poverty and failures but in our prosperity. We ought to be thankful and magnify the name of the lord when those who serve God in truth and spirit prosper and not castigate or criticize them.

Jesus Christ came to take away our poverty. "For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor that ye through his poverty might be rich". 2 Cor. 8:9. If the followers of Jesus are richer than Jesus, that is how it should be, for he purposed it that way. We strongly believe and recognize the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ that He was so very rich yet He exchanged His riches for our poverty. He that was rich became poor and we that were poor became so rich. This is a divine exchange. If by His crucifixion He took our death, sins, sickness and diseases why doubt His taking our poverty? He made us rich in love and favour with God, rich in blessings and promises of the new covenant, rich in the hopes of eternal life. Our Lord Jesus' first miracle



was a miracle of divine provision (John 2:2-11) His anointing was first of all, to address the poverty of the poor (Luke. 4:18). Demonstrated His power and mastery over lack.

The Earlier Church Did Not Lack (With Our Lord Jesus and with the apostles) Living with the primary mission of making money is a suicide mission. Money only funds our God's given mission. Our Lord Jesus demonstrated this when he sent his disciples out for preaching (Luke 22:35). We must know that Christ is a good master, and his service is good. When we live by contributions of friends and well-wishers let us not be ashamed and complain that our maintenance is precarious but rather let it be sufficient unto us. Come to think of it, everything we have was given to us by God. There is nothing special about any man except the grace and the gift from God. The source God has chosen should not be an issue. Even when people choose to work to support their ministry, the bulk of the fund comes from gifts (divine provision). Not only did the church not lack when Jesus was on earth, but they never lacked when he departed (Acts 4:34). The idea that the church should be poor for it to be holy or accepted is not scriptural. We the later saints should oppose it. It is not the doctrine of the prophets or the apostles. The church of Jesus Christ never lacked when he was on earth physically and when he departed, the apostles carried on a prosperous church that non suffer lack (Acts 4:34). Religion teaches people to do nothing, give nothing and have nothing on earth, that they will have all things in heaven. Spirituality teaches that whatever we give for the sake of God's kingdom here on earth we shall have a hundredfold here on earth and heaven (life to come Matt. 19:29). Paradoxically, Jesus Christ was never a religious man. If he was, he would have stayed in the temple with the Pharisees and Sadducees, the religious men of His days (Matt. 16). Rather he chose to be on the street doing good works and attending to the needs of the people (Acts 10:38). It is men that have made religion out of him. Invariably man always loves and wants religion (Exo. 32) and God seeks relationship (John 15:14-15).

GOD SHINES THROUGH *Flawed People*

God wants to use all humans for His glory to tell the world what the Lord Jesus Christ did for them on the cross. Many people are not aware of this, while those who are aware are either shy or think they don't have good communication skills. Many others look down on themselves because of their family background. We judge ourselves by the world's standards. Our family was just average. We aren't rich by any means, and we don't have powerful connections. Even if we wish to make a difference in this world for Christ, we doubt that we ever could. All that is required of us is to let the Lord know that we would do whatever He wants us to do, with the abilities that He would give us and ask Him for guidance. The Lord will always be gracious and use us.

We must recognize that the world doesn't work like God does. The world looks at a person's qualifications, and the one with the best credentials is the person who usually gets the job. Every time you go for a job interview, the business that is seeking to hire someone looks to see if you are qualified. Most employers want to see a resume to find out something about you, such as your education, past job history, and references. Each time, a company hires the one whom they feel best fitted for the position for which they are interviewing. A majority of the time, they won't even look at a person with no experience.

Interestingly, God isn't like that. He does just the opposite. He chooses the unqualified and makes them qualified. The Apostle Paul said this much in 1 Corinthians 1:26-30 "For consider your calling, brethren, that there were not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble; but God has chosen the foolish things of the world to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong, and the base things of the world and the despised God has chosen, the things that are not, so that He may nullify the

things that are, so that no man may boast before God. But by His doing, you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification, and redemption"

If we look back through the Scriptures, it has always been the case that God had taken flawed people in some ways and given them a central place in His plan of salvation for the world. Indeed, God could not have looked at Adam



and Eve after their sin in the Garden of Eden. He could have destroyed them on the spot and started over again with another creature. However, He didn't do that. He promised Eve that it would be her offspring that would ultimately defeat Satan and his followers. Genesis 3:15 "And I will put enmity between you and the woman, And between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, And you shall bruise His heel." Throughout salvation history, the Lord has continued to use flawed men and women to shine forth his glory in this evil world.

Let us consider some of the flawed people from the Old Testament.

Noah. It is interesting that if we look at the most famous Bible characters, they are on display, warts and all. Noah, for instance, though he was the great man of faith that built the Ark, later he got drunk and laid naked in his tent. Genesis 9:21. "Then he drank of the wine and was drunk, and became uncovered in his tent."

Abraham. Abraham, the patriarch of the Jewish nation, through whom all of the nations of the earth would be blessed, lied about his wife being his sister, not once but twice, because he was afraid that he would be killed. Genesis 12 and 20. Sarah, Abraham's wife, was physically unqualified to have a son through which all the nations of the world would be blessed. Isaac's birth came about from a miracle. Abraham was 100 years old when Isaac was born (Genesis 21:5), and Sarah, at age 90, had been unable to have children (Genesis 16:1, 17:17). But Scripture tells us, Then God said, "Yes, but your wife Sarah will bear you a son, and you will call him Isaac." Genesis 17:19. It is no coincidence that the name Isaac means laughter. There is probably a double meaning behind this. First is the fact that after all those years, God brought laughter into the household of these two old people. Secondly, Sarah laughed in disbelief at the thought that she would have a son in her old age - Genesis 18:12-14. However, God had the last laugh.

Jacob. The patriarch Jacob was a deceiver. He took advantage of his brother Esau when he was hungry and got Esau to give up his birthright. He later, with the help of his mother, tricked his father Isaac into giving him the blessing of the firstborn instead of Esau (Genesis 25:19-34; 27:1-4).

Moses. Moses was a reluctant leader. He told the Lord to get someone else to lead the people of Israel out of Egypt and into the Promised Land because he had a speech impediment (Exodus 4:10-11). God gave him Aaron to talk for him and sent him anyway. Later, Moses showed that he had a temper when he angrily struck the rock that the Lord told him to speak to, so as to get water for the people of Israel. In his anger, he didn't give the Lord the credit for the water but glorified himself and Aaron. Because of this, Moses, who led God's people to the Promised land for 40 years, didn't make it in himself (Numbers 20:1-12).

King David. King David was called a "man after God's own heart." (1 Samuel 13:14; Acts 13:22). Yet he was the youngest of 10 of Jesse's children, who seemed to be the least likely to succeed. But God did not look at the outward appearance. The Lord looked at the heart. 1 Samuel 16:7. But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look at his appearance or at his physical stature, because I have refused him. For the Lord does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." He was a shepherd boy, keeping his father's flocks when Samuel was told to anoint him - 1 Samuel 16:1-13. Sadly, later, we see his flaws as well. He became an adulterer and a murderer. He took Bathsheba, the wife of Uriah the Hittite, slept with her, and killed Uriah to cover up his sin. After Uriah's death, David made Bathsheba one of his many wives (2 Samuel 11). But because of David's repentance, God continued to use him for his glory.

King Solomon. King Solomon, David's son, started very well. God, in a dream, told Solomon to ask for anything, and he'd give it to him. Solomon asked for wisdom to rule God's people well. God was pleased and gave him what he desired. He became one of the wisest men who ever lived. God also gave him great wealth as well. 2 Chronicles 1:7-12. However, later in life, Solomon married many foreign women who turned his heart toward other gods. And he was no longer fully devoted to the Lord 1 Kings 11:1-8. It was because of this sin that God tore the Kingdom apart shortly after Solomon died - 1 Kings 11:9-13. These are just a few of the Old Testament examples of the imperfect people that the Lord had chosen to use. We could name many more, for they all were imperfect in some way.



Rahab. Rahab was one of the ancestors of Jesus despite being a harlot. Rahab found favour from God and survived the conquering of Jericho by hiding the Israelite spies who were checking out the promised land in order to take it over.

Esther. Whose story is in a book by her name. Esther's birth name was Hadassah. She was of the tribe of Benjamin and lived during the time Israel was exiled. Though nothing special about herself, through faith, she eventually became a queen who saved her entire nation from destruction. Esther reminds us that nothing is impossible with God.

Let us also consider some New Testament examples.

The Twelve Apostles. The twelve Apostles that the Lord chose were nothing special before he picked them. We know that Peter, Andrew, James, and John

were fishermen. Matthew came from a hated group at that time. He was a tax collector. The rest of their professions are not named, which leads us to conclude that status didn't matter in Christ's choice of these men.

Apostle Peter. Apostle Peter out of fear at Jesus' trial that ultimately led to the Lord's crucifixion, denied Christ 3 times. He earlier told Christ that, though all would desert him, he would remain faithful. Matthew 26:33-35. All the other Apostles fled for their lives when Christ was taken. None stayed to defend their Master Matthew 26:55; 56. However, except Judas, who betrayed Him, God used these men to change the world with the Gospel. And the world has never been the same!

The Apostle Paul. Paul the Apostle was called Saul before his conversion. He persecuted and killed the followers of Christ, thinking he was doing God's work (Acts 8:3). He later called himself "the worst of sinners" 1 Timothy 1:15. And yet after his conversion, it could be argued that Paul became one of the greatest Christian evangelists of all time. He wrote a vast portion of the New Testament, and like all but one of the other Apostles, John was martyred for his faith. Paul also had what he called his "thorn in the flesh," a messenger of Satan to buffet him, to keep him from exalting himself (2 Corinthians 12:7). We don't know what it was, but it was so bad that he asked God to remove it 3 times. However, God said to him: "My grace is sufficient for you, for my strength is made perfect in weakness." 2 Corinthians 12:8. As far as we know, Paul had this problem for the rest of his life. Yet God continued to use him mightily for his glory.

We could have many more Bible characters that God used greatly despite their flaws, but the ones listed above should prove the point. The Lord didn't choose perfect people because there were no such creatures. He used ordinary, everyday individuals like you and I, for the most part, who would not have been chosen by this world. They were His vessels to show forth His glory and power to a lost and dying world. The obvious parallel here is that if the Lord can use these flawed individuals, he can certainly use any of us. The more flawed you are, the greater God's glory can shine through you as a trophy of His grace. So don't ever think that our Lord can never use you.

God doesn't call the qualified; He qualifies the called. If you have accepted Jesus into your life and are sure of your salvation, He has called you to be one of His ambassadors. 2 Corinthians 5:20 says "Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God." What a wonderful and marvelous calling that is!

We should be more determined to ask God to use us, the weak and flawed vessel, to get out his message of grace to a lost world. We must be determined, as well, that He would receive all of the glory for what we do. May all who love the Lord have this same attitude so that together, we can watch God's strength shine through our weakness!



WHEN THE SON of MAN comes will He find faith on earth?

INTRODUCTION

Until Jesus returns, we cannot stop talking about Faith. A man without faith is like someone going to market without money. Every redeemed child of God should be able to know and have what the Lord is looking for at His second coming. Anyone who finds the answer to this question and engages in it has found pleasing God to be a lifestyle and a delight.

2. Some facts about faith.

i. The same way all things are possible with God, so also all things are possible to him that believes, who is persuaded that our God can do what He has said. What God can do, faith can make happen. Jer 32:27, Mk 9:23.

ii. The same way money answereth all things, faith also answereth All things. It is a universal currency! Lk 1:45.

iii. As the purchasing power of a man depends on the amount of money he has, so also what a man receives or does in life depends on his level of faith.

iv. The same way money gives one authority and command over what he desires to buy, even faith gives one authority and control over the things of life. Lk 8:25

v. The same way one needs to source for money to have purchasing power, so does one need to source for faith to have things done. Rom 10:17, Jud 20

vi. Money comes from doing service, work, or business. Faith comes by hearing and practicing the Word of God.

vii. The same way money grows by applying Covenant practices, faith grows by continuously hearing, understanding, and practicing the Word. Rom 10:17, Jam 1:22-25.

So in line with the above, we must also take note of the following:

i. That the faith walk is a responsibility every individual must take. Any faith that leaves all the responsibilities to God is fake.

ii. The Faith that works must be mixed with the Word to produce results. Heb 4:2.

iii. For tangible results, one must engage faith-driven thoughts, words and actions. Lk 6:45, Jam 2:20, 2 Cor 4:13,

3. His teachings on faith.

(a). Lk 17:5-9.

'And the apostles said unto the LORD increase our faith.

And the Lord said, "If ye had faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this sycamore tree, be thou plucked up by the root, and be thou planted in the sea; and it should obey you. But which of you, having a servant plowing or feeding cattle will say unto him by and by, Go and sit down to meat. And will not rather say unto him, make ready wherewithal I may sup, and gird thyself, and serve me till I have eaten and drunken; and afterward thou shalt eat and drink? Doth he thank that servant because he did the things that were commanded him.

(b). The unjust Judge. Lk 18:1-8

At the end of this parable was where He asked the question we are seeking an answer to. The widow could not give up or accept no for an answer. He then asked '...nevertheless when the son of man cometh, shall He find faith in the earth?

From the Scriptures, some questions and their



answers may lead us to the answer we are looking for.

i. Are you genuinely born again? Have you burnt the bridge behind you? Esth 4:6. Some of us got transferred instead of being translated from the kingdom of darkness to the kingdom of light. Being transferred means that you carried all or some of your baggage from one place to another; while translation means total transformation.

Col 1:13 "Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness and hath translated us into the Kingdom of His dear son".

Our Father will be looking for transformed people. People who are sold out to Him in all aspects of life in the world.

ii. Do you recognize Christ as your head in all things? Are you conscious of His presence? Do you value His presence? Are you following "The Pillar of Cloud", moving when He moves and stopping where He stops? Ex 23:21-22.

iii. Are your thoughts, words and actions consistent with what obtains in the kingdom of Light where you claim to belong?

iv. Do you insist that His Kingdom come and His will be done in your life, family, community, workplace, and on earth? When He comes will find men who are audacious and tenacious in the pursuit of kingdom advancement. Joseph of Arimathea went to Pilate to demand for the body of Christ. A coward could not have done that.

v. Do you have a real knowledge of what and who is under your authority and control? Authority was the first thing people noticed about our Lord, Jesus. Mk 1:22/27.

"And they were astonished at His doctrine: for He taught them as one that had authority, and not as the Scribes".

Our Lord knew the extent of His power and authority, and He exercised it over the whole of His creation: evil spirits, sicknesses, diseases, death, wind, storms, etc.

Will He find men exercising such power, authority, and control on earth? Will He see men who have continued from where He stopped, even now? "A city that is set on a hill cannot be hid". Matt 5:14.

OF THE WORLD

Introduction

Every born again believer is the light of the world. Jesus said, "You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden" (Matthew 5:14). As a true believer, you

must know who you are, your identity.

When Jesus was in this world, He knew who He was. He said, "I am the LIGHT OF THE WORLD. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12, NIV). He said, "As long as I am in the world, I am the LIGHT OF THE WORLD" (John 9:5).

Our Lord Jesus Christ did not only know His identity as the light of the world, He also declared it, and manifested as light. Jesus said, "As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world" (John 17:18).

BIBLICAL DESCRIPTION OF THE WORLD

The scripture says, "You are the light of the world..." (Matthew 5:14).

1. The "World" is described as EVIL. Galatians 1:4 says, "Who gave himself for our sins, that he might deliver us from this PRESENT EVIL WORLD..."

2. The Bible says, "... The whole world LIETH IN WICKEDNESS" (1 John 5:19). This world is full of wickedness.

3. The world is described as a DARK WORLD full of crooked and perverse people. The Bible says, "... You are to live clean, innocent lives as children of God in a DARK WORLD full of people who are crooked and stubborn..." (Philippians 2:15, LB).

4. The world is also described as a CORRUPT WORLD with corrupt people. The scripture says, "So that you may be innocent and pure as God's perfect children, who live in a WORLD OF CORRUPT PEOPLE..." (Philippians 2:15, GNB).

5. The Bible described Satan as THE PRINCE AND THE god of this world. The scripture says, "Now is the judgment of this world: now shall the prince of this world be cast out" (John 12:31). Satan, the god of this evil world, has blinded the minds of those who don't believe, so they are unable to see the glorious light of the Good News that is shining upon them..." (2 Corinthians 4:4, NLT).

6. The Bible says, "For, behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, and gross darkness the people..." (Isaiah 60:2).

7. This world is under the power and control of the evil one (Satan). The Bible says, "We know that we are children of God and that the world around us is under the power and control of the evil one" (1 John 5:19, NLT). 8 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT A BELIEVER AS THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD.

1. Light is so powerful

Light is more powerful than darkness. The Bible says, "And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not" (John 1:5).

The Amplified Bible says, "And the light shines on in the darkness, for darkness has never overpowered it [put it out or absorbed it or appropriated it, and is unresponsive to it]."

LIGHT represents or speaks of righteousness, truth, goodness, life, knowledge, godliness. While DARKNESS represents or speaks sin, unrighteousness, evil, wickedness, corruption deception, confusion, death, ignorance, etc.

Jesus as the light of the world shines in darkness, and the darkness could not overcome Him. Darkness was unable to overcome Jesus because there was no darkness in Him. The Bible says, "... God is light, and in Him is not darkness at all" (1 John 1:5).

Satan was unable to defeat Jesus as the light of the world because there was no trace of any evil or unrighteousness in Him. The scripture says, "The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light. And for those who lived in the land where death casts its shadow, a light has shined" (Matthew 4:16, NLT).

As a the light of the world, you are more powerful than the darkness. NO MATTER THE DARKNESS OF SIN, EVIL AND WICKEDNESS AROUND, A TRUE BORN AGAIN BELIEVER WILL ALWAYS OVERCOME.

2. Light is designed to shine.

As the light of the world, you are designed to shine. You must be set up as light and shine as light. The scripture says that light cannot be hidden (Matthew 5:14-15). No one lights a candle and put it under a bushel. No! Jesus said, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father which is in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

Isaiah 60:1 says, "Arise, shine; for thy light is come, and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee."

The scripture says, "And the light shines in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not" (John 1:5).

JUST AS THE SUN DOES NOT STRUGGLE TO SHINE BECAUSE SHINING IS ITS NATURE, SO ALSO IS EVERY TRUE BELIEVER.

3. Light is needed everywhere and everyday by majority of people.

Believers as light, are needed by the people of the world who are covered with darkness of sin, sickness and disease, with darkness of guilt and condemnation, with darkness of delusion, confusion and fear, with darkness of poverty and destitution, with darkness of enslavement and defeat, etc.

The Bible says, "For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God" (Romans 8:19).

Isaiah 60:1-2 says, "ARISE, SHINE; for the light is come and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee. For, behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, and gross darkness the people: but the LORD shall arise upon thee, and his glory shall be seen upon thee."

Jesus manifested and shined as the light of the world. The Bible says, "The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light. And for those who lived in the land where death casts its shadow, a light has shined" (Matthew 4:16, NLT).

As the light of the world, the people in your neighborhood, place of work, community who are in bondage to sin, sickness, poverty, fear, confusion and to Satan are waiting for your manifestation, for their deliverance and liberation.

In John 5:35 Jesus testified of John Baptist. He said, "He was a burning and a shining light: and you were willing to rejoice for a while in his light."

John Baptist manifested as light and brought freedom and joy to people in his generation.



Are you burning and shining as light in your neighborhood and place of work?

4. Light reveals, exposes, making manifest what is hidden.

The scripture says, "But when the light shines on them, it becomes clear how evil these things are. And where your light shines, it will expose their evil deeds..." (Ephesians 5:13-14, NLT).

When your light is burning and shining as a believer, no works of darkness will be able to operate where you are. It is only when you fail to shine as light that you give room for darkness to operate. It is in the absence of light that darkness operates.

As light, your life must expose the evil works of darkness around you. Evil, dubious and corrupt people should not feel comfortable where you are. If they are comfortable where you are, it means you are not shining as light. If you are actually shining as the light of the world, there will be no place for evil and corruption in your place of work.

As the light of the world, "Are you really shining as light? Remember, you are designed to shine as light!

Pray this prayer: O Lord my God, whatever that is not making me to shine as light in my life, consume them out by fire, in the name of Jesus.
